

Latino Community Trends

- Ohio Hispanics
 - o 505,000 individuals
 - 20% of individuals live below the poverty line
 - o 7.9% unemployment rate
- Franklin County Hispanics
 - o 91,182 individuals
 - o 6.9% of population identifies as Hispanic







Latino Community Trends

- Higher rates of unemployment
- Higher rates of poverty
- Increased barriers in language, technology, and varying immigration status
- Lack of reliable transportation
- Lack of affordable housing
- Increased number of immigrants from Venezuela & Dominican Republic



HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH



Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in any program or activity that receives Federal funds or other Federal financial assistance. Persons with limited English proficiency must be afforded a meaningful opportunity to participate in programs that receive Federal funds.

Example of violation:


- 1. Not providing language assistance to Limited English Proficient (LEP) individuals
- 2. Asking for citizenship status only to individuals who look or sound foreign




