Upper Arlington, recently incorporated into a village, held a special municipal election on June 20th, and named a full set of officers to govern it.

Fifty-one of the fifty-five vuters cast their ballot and the entire ticket was elected unanimously save for the office of marshal, in which Ben S. Thompson defeated Dave Warwick by a very alender margin. The full se of officers named follows: Mayor, James T. Miller; clerk, E. Howard; treasurer, W. A. Armstrong; marshal, Ben S. Thompson, and members of council, J. J. Morgun, E. J. Crane, J. E. Harris, W. F. Kern, Frunk Rogers and Paul Spence.
