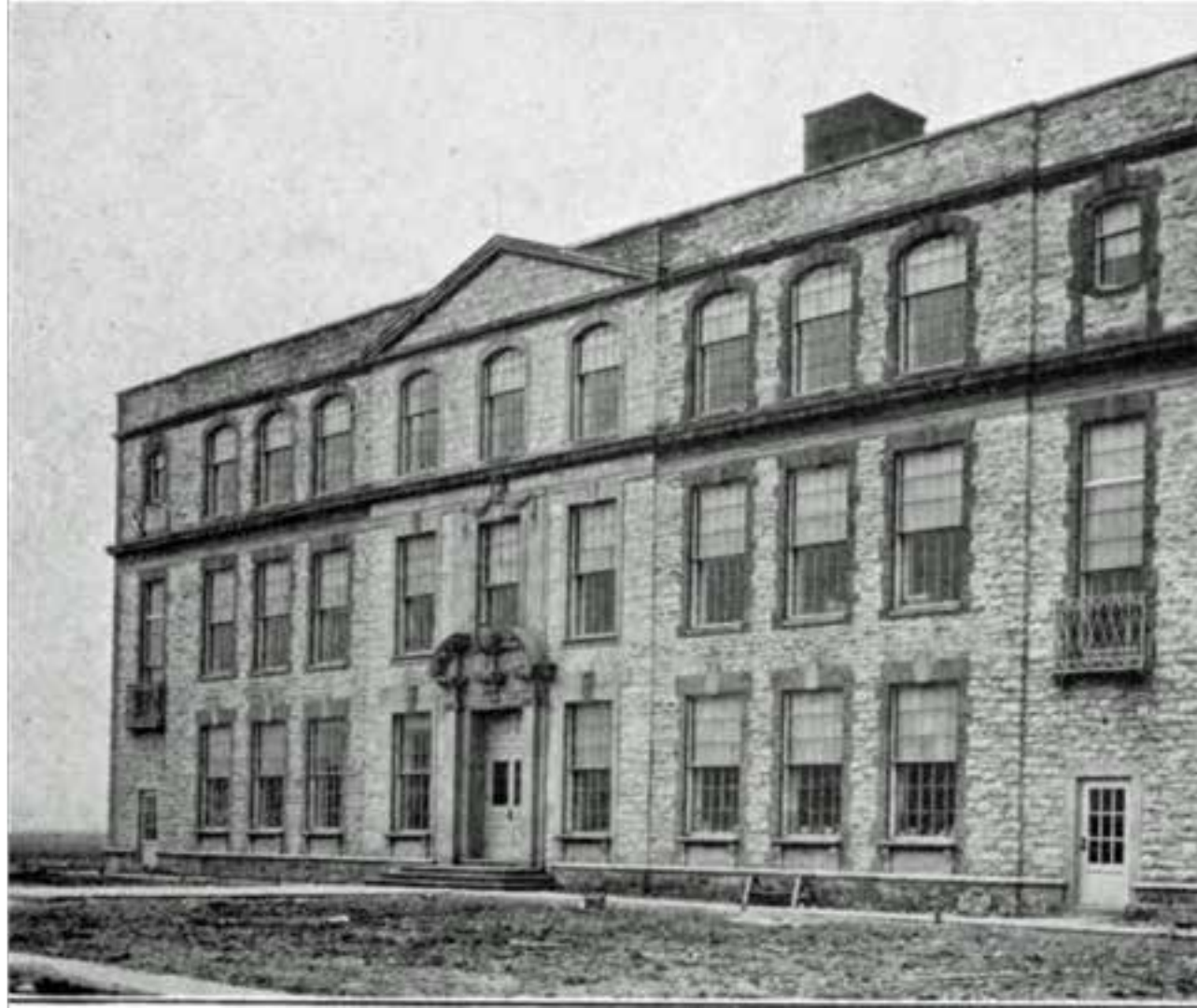

The Upper Arlington School Board approved the purchase of a 34-acre McCoy Rd. tract Tuesday night as a possible site for a second senior high school for the city.

School Superintendent Walter Heischman said Wednesday the cost of the land will be approximately \$5000 an acre. The tract is west of Reed Rd., near the Mountview and Woodbridge

New High School Rejected By Arlington School Board

The Upper Arlington School Board has decided to keep all its high school students in one basket and announced Thursday that it will not consider building a new high school.

The board took the position that an addition to the present high school would be sufficient to handle the suburbs enrollment in the future.

THE STAND IS based on a premise that the city will not annex land to the north of the present school district.

Board representatives will approach City Council Monday remind council that on April 24, 1961, council took a stand against northern annexation.

At next month's meeting, the board will again discuss the needs of expanding all school facilities and it has been hinted by officials that a November bond issue may be forthcoming.

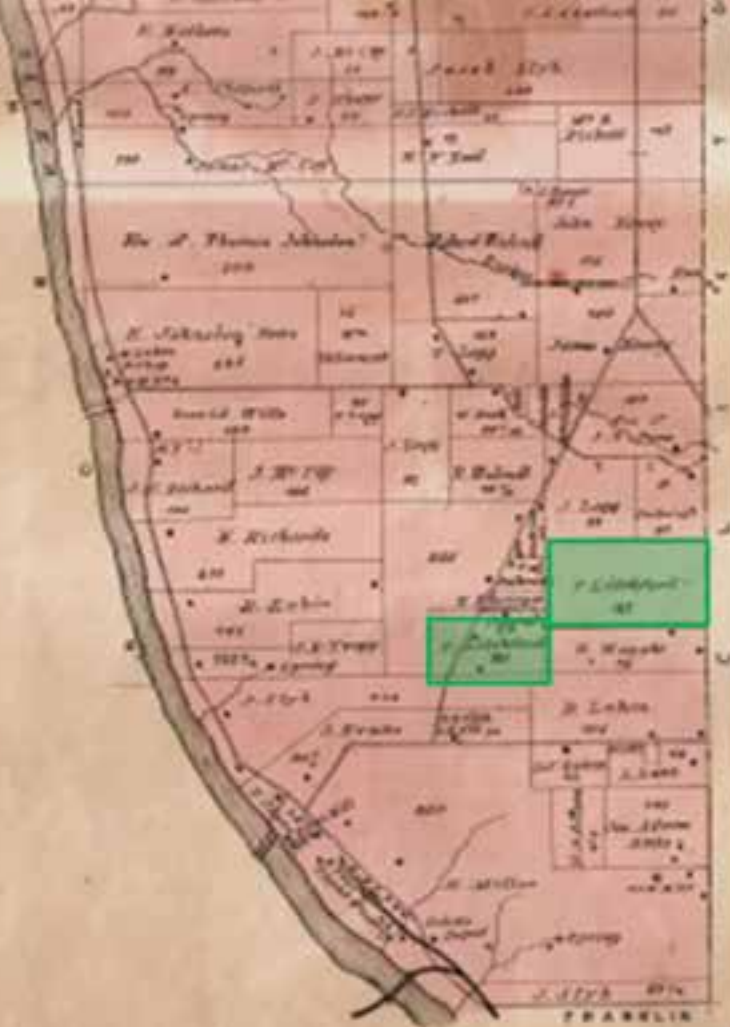
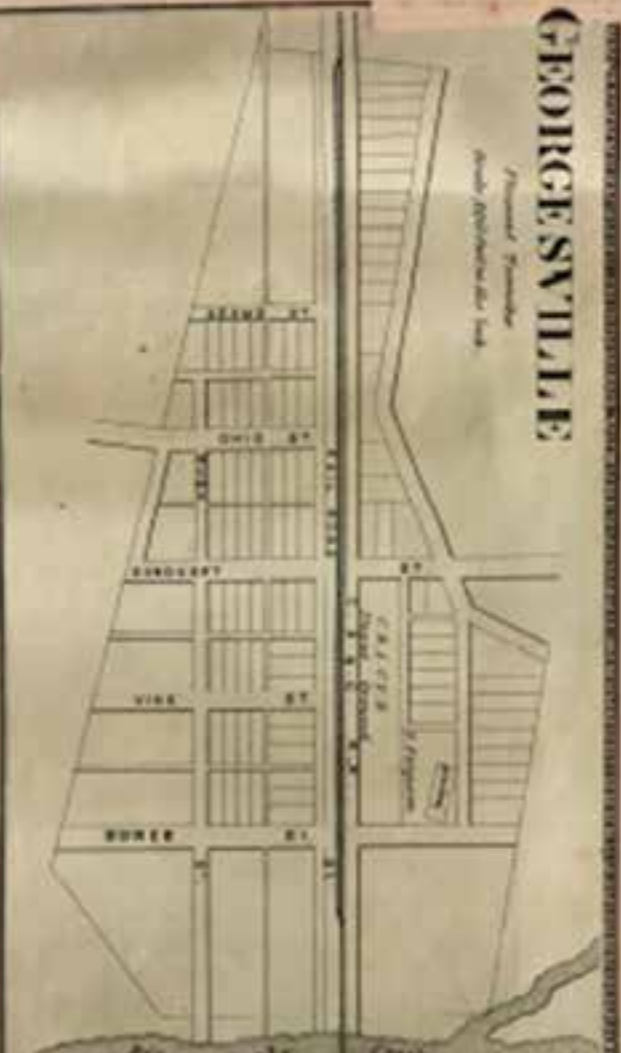

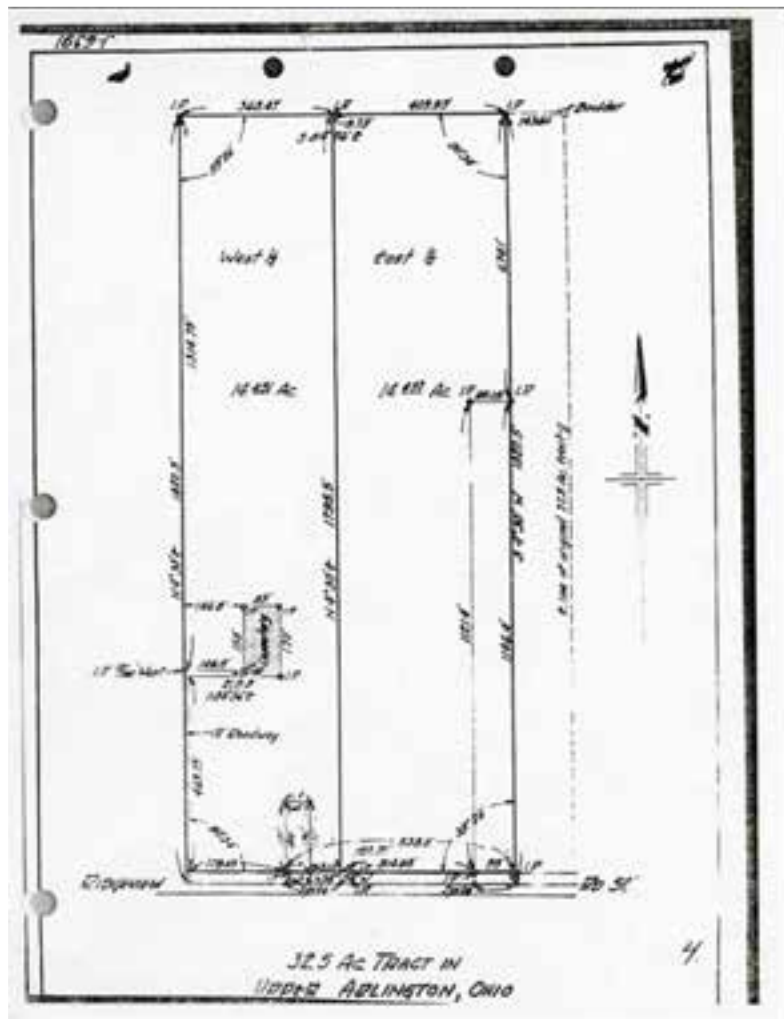
Death of a Pioneer.

Pleasant Litchford died at Madison, Indiana, Sunday, April 6, at the advanced age of eighty-nine years. He had lived in and near Columbus since 1831, when he moved here with his family from Campbell county, Virginia. He was a blacksmith by trade. He first camped in this city where the City Park now is, which was then a dense woods, but soon moved to a small farm which he pur-

chased and which he owned till his death. He added to his farm, which at the time of his death contained 227 acres, valued at \$23,000, located a little over four miles from Columbus. He was a man of iron constitution; a devout Christian, the oldest member of the Second Baptist Church, on Gay street, and the last surviving person who helped to organize the colored Baptist Church of this city. He was an Elder and local preacher in his church, and a consistent member of it for seventy-eight years. During the last years of his life, as he was so situated that he could not attend church, a religious newspaper, the Gospel Messenger, and the STATE JOURNAL became sources of untold satisfaction to him. He was married three times; his first wife was Catherine Fisher, who bore him eleven children, seven of whom are living; his second wife, who died two years after marriage, was Frances Evens; and his third wife, who survives him, was Charlotte Stewart. At his death he had twenty-five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
